TRAINING OPTIONS



MUNICIPAL ADA COORDINATOR TRAINING

Every municipality with 50 or more employees is required to designate at least one responsible employee to coordinate ADA compliance.

The ADA Coordinator is responsible for coordinating ADA compliance efforts and investigating any complaints.

ADACC has identified nine topics that are most crucial to ADA Coordinator training and offers them in four sessions on a rotating basis throughout the year in March, June, September and December. Classes are \$20 for ADACC Members and \$40 for Non-Members.

CT MUNICIPAL ADA COORDINATOR CERTIFICATION

For ADACC Members who complete all nine topics, Connecticut Certification will be awarded. This designation ensures that the ADA Coordinator has the knowledge

and understanding of the law to be effective.

ADA CHECKLIST TRAINING FOR ORGANIZATIONS, BUSINESSES AND FACILITIES

The ADA Checklist is a comprehensive tool that can help identify barriers to accessibility in your facility, business or organization. While it can be daunting to go it alone, ADACC can offer a three hour training session for key personnel covering the essentials. The basic fee for this training is \$175 per hour.

ADA CHECKLIST TRAINING AND GUIDED FIELD BASED ASSESSMENTS

In this training an ADA professional will spend approximately three hours training your key personnel on the ADA Checklist and then guide them through a "field based assessment." At the end of the assessment you will have identified areas which need attention to be brought into compliance with the ADA.

The base fee for this training is \$1,000 for six hours and \$175 for each additional hour. There may be additional expenses based on location, travel and accommodations.

The amount of time the field based assessment will take depends on the size of the facility and how many staff will be working on the assessment.
